Acceptable Use Agreement for Technology in the Educational Environment

These rules may not be exhaustive in all circumstances. Students should always inquire of a teacher or adult supervisor if they are not sure that what they are doing is permitted.

1. Each and every time a student logs on to a computer or other network device, s/he will be reminded that the machine and any access it provides are strictly for educational purposes only.
2. When and if a student is using his/her own electronic device in the school environment, all the same rules apply to that device as apply to computers provided by the school district.
3. Use of technology and technological access is a privilege not a right. Misuse or abuse of technology privileges may result in the loss of those privileges. In addition, consequences may be imposed as prescribed by the Guidelines for Student Behavior for any behavior violations accomplished via electronic means.
4. Misuse of technological tools, the district network, software programs or internet access include but are not limited to:
 - Attempting to bypass filters and/or firewalls
 - Providing personal or network identity information
 - Sharing passwords
 - Installing or altering any program of any kind
 - Accessing and/or sharing private information of others or network information
 - Running unauthorized programs from flash drives or external devices (including iPods, MP3 devices, phones, memory chips, etc.)
 - Any act of vandalism, theft, plagiarism, harassment, etc., accomplished via electronic means
 - Attempting to disable or block network services by means of unauthorized access or excessive network traffic.
