Summary

Provide generalized health services to students under guidelines provided by the school nurse; routine record keeping, and student supervision.

Distinguishing Characteristics

This position works independently under the direction of a certificated and licensed school nurse. This position is under the direct supervision of the Director of Students Services.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

Incumbents may perform any combination of the essential duties listed below. This job description is not intended to be an exhaustive list of all duties, knowledge, or abilities associated with this classification, but are intended to accurately reflect the principle job elements.

- Provide, after training, the following medical procedures including, but not limited to, administration of medication including insulin, blood glucose checks, insulin pump use, NG tube feeding, and gastronomy tube feeding. Procedures will be monitored by the school nurse.
- Care for ill students in the classroom; take action in emergency situations; assist students with personal care
- Perform a variety of record-keeping activities involving charting student progress and the
 administration of medical procedures according to established procedures; set up and maintain
 student health, immunization, and emergency medical records; assist school nurse with
 physical screening and other appraisal evaluations; assist with head lice checks
- Maintain health office, medical supplies, and equipment
- Work with school improvement initiatives that close student achievement gaps between racial, ethnic, and economic groups by working with all of the diverse communities
- Perform related duties as assigned

Qualifications

Knowledge and Skills

- Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and first aid
- Ability to be taught required health skills by District registered nurse
- Correct English usage, spelling, grammar, punctuation, vocabulary and mathematical skills
- Interpersonal skills using tact, patience, and courtesy
- Medical record keeping, filing, and confidentiality requirements
- Health and safety regulations

Abilities

- Perform the basic function of the position.
- Maintain accurate and confidential records.
- Respond effectively to emergencies.
- Work cooperatively with students, teachers, nurses, and others.
- Work under direction.
- Perform moderate lifting of students according to safety regulations.
- Work with school improvement initiatives that close student achievement gaps between racial, ethnic, and economic groups by working with all of the diverse communities.

Physical Abilities
